At Birkwood Primary School your child has the opportunity to learn in exciting ways. The internet and other technologies are a part of this learning and we want children to use them safely at all times. To support this, regular whole school assemblies focus on eSafety alongside specific eSafety sessions for Key Stage 2 pupils. We'd like you to sign this form to show that you accept our golden rules and adopt them at home for safe use of technology.

<p>Treat your password like your toothbrush – don't share it with anyone or try to use anyone else's password.</p> <p>Be polite and responsible when communicating with others.</p> <p>Tell an adult if you see anything you are unsure about including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - damage to equipment - upsetting images or text - websites that are not allowed <p>Report bullying whether it is to you or others including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - online bullying - email bullying - text bullying <p>Always follow instructions when using a PC or other technology.</p>	<p>Don't talk to strangers online.</p> <p>Don't share any personal information such as your full name, date of birth, or address.</p> <p>Never agree to meet with anyone in person that you have met on line.</p> <p>Don't use school equipment for personal use unless you have permission from a teacher.</p> <p>Don't upload or download files that may be upsetting to others.</p> <p>Never open attachments unless you know who sent them.</p> <p>Don't be a bully. That includes verbally, physically or with technology such as the internet, email or mobile phones.</p>

This eBehaviour Agreement is intended to ensure:

- that young people will be responsible users and stay safe while using the internet and other communications technologies for educational, personal and recreational use.
- that the school's ICT systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and users at risk.
- that you share the good practice and responsibility of keeping your child safe with regard to their on-line behaviour.

The school will ensure that your child will have access to ICT to enhance their learning and will, in return, expect the pupils to agree to be responsible users. A copy of the Child/Young Person eBehaviour Agreement that has been accepted by your child is attached so that you are aware of the school's expectations of the young people in our care.

You are **requested to sign the permission form attached and return it** to school to show you support us in this important issue.
