Essential Knowledge

Fold mountains occur when tectonic plates collide.

Fault-block mountains occur when cracks in the Earth's surface open up; large chucks of rock can be pushed up while others are pushed down.

Volcanic mountains are made of layers of ash and cooled lava.

Dome mountains are formed when magma is forced up between the crust and the mantle, but doesn't ever flow out.

Plateau mountains form because of materials being taken away through erosion, which has left deep valleys or gorges next to high cliffs.

The Rockies are located in North America; the Andes are located in South America; the Alps are located in Europe.
