

Review of 2023-24 Sports Premium

- -We have once again continued to benefit significantly from the Sports Premium throughout 2023 -24. Our leader is a highly regarded and valued member of the team and we are very fortunate that he has sought after opportunities to better sporting experiences for our children.
- -Over the year, our PE Leaders have been able to review provision and implement a Complete PE progression of skill and knowledge for the teaching and learning of PE. He has worked with the staff and children to introduce new skills and knowledge, as well as ensuring that the children have effective progress and developments in the PE curriculum.
- -A wide range of diverse and inclusive sports have been introduced alongside the traditional games, dance and gymnastic elements, ensuring access and provision meets the needs of all pupils. This has been integrated into the school day with many opportunities to participate during direct and indirect time.
- Our extracurricular offer remains free, and we have dedicated time to provide an inclusive package which offers opportunities for ALL. We endeavor to continue this, constantly striving to drive participation even further year on year.
- -In addition, work has been dedicated to further developing junior sports leaders next year, hoping that this will provide even more opportunities.
- -We have worked hard to raise the profile of the celebration of sports and being active, during our learning assemblies, the leaders present sport awards for each week, recognizing contribution to PE. In addition to this, sports competitions and fixtures are recognized and celebrated.
- -Our website is a showcase of all the fantastic opportunities that children receive through PE and sport, where they are provided with Birkwood kit and are given the chance to work as part of a team and represent their school. This has allowed us to involve a wide range of children, promoting physical and mental health development. Despite our lack of a school field, the new year brings many exciting opportunities with the build of our new all-weather pitch, providing opportunities for our children to participate, and offering other children within our locality (of different schools) to visit and participate in sporting events and competitions.
